

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# Fiscal Management

## **Funding Channel**

AB104 legislation states that each Consortia may decide to designate a fiscal administrator to receive and distribute AEBG funds. If a member agency is chosen to be the fund administrator, the member shall commit to developing a process to apportion funds to each member of the consortium pursuant to the consortium's adult education plan within 45 days of receiving funds appropriated for the program. This process shall not require a consortium member to be funded on a reimbursement basis.

#### Rationale

Provide details regarding the rationale for your fiscal structure decision. How did you arrive at the decision? What were the overwhelming benefits to using this structure?

The NSCCSTC Leadership Board chose a direct funding model to expedite funding disbursement and avoid administrative and clerical delays in expenditure reporting. Throughout the AEBG regional planning process, the NSCCSTC Leadership Board used MVLA as their fiscal agent for planning funds. During this period, inconsistency in

how institutions define budget object codes made fund disbursement and reporting difficult and time-consuming. They also found that this role placed a large administrative burden on the fiscal agent. The Board decided that managing funds directly would be a more efficient fiscal structure.

For the past three years, the Board has since opted for a direct funding structure. Members have found that this structure evenly distributes the workload of managing the consortium finances across each member and results in decreased administrative barriers and delays in fund disbursement and expenditure reporting. The Board has also noted that this approach allows each institution greater flexibility in using funds to develop and expand adult education services as well as to respond to the needs of adult learners at their institutions. Given the benefits of this structure, the Board will continue the direct funding structure for FY 2017-18.

### Fiscal Management Approach

Whether using a fiscal agent or direct funding model, describe how you are fiscally managing your block grant. How are you rolling up grant expenditures to report to the State?

Keith Moody, Principal at Mountain View Los Altos Adult School, has served as the AEBG Project Director for the Board since 2014. Mr. Moody is responsible for collating combined expenses that each consortium member sends to him and submitting expenditure reports to the state.

As a direct funding consortium, each member is responsible for managing AEBG funds in compliance with AEBG Guidance and Regulations. Member institutions also must submit their expenditure reports to the Project Director in a timely manner and make corrections or adjustments as needed. At monthly Leadership Board Meetings, members discuss fiscal management issues as they arise and work together to identify potential solutions. The Board has also contracted with a consulting firm, Resource Development Associates, to provide the consortium with implementation services that support fiscal management and expenditure reporting processes.
